



**Survey Conducted by Monroe County School District

**Question: Select the job description that best describes your work for Monroe County Schools.**




**Question: Which best describes your retirement status with the Monroe County School District?**

### Living Status



### Rent-Utilities Cost



### Housing Interest



### Current Travel Distance



### Willing Travel Options



### Comments sent to Superintendent Randy Acevedo after the survey:

Is there an appropriate way for a staff member to let other teachers know about an apartment for rent? I don't feel comfortable using the district e-mail for this. An on-line bulletin board might be helpful.

The medical insurance and the housing issues are the two huge issues for me. I have never really been sick before and yet in the last couple years I have had to dip into my savings (what was my nest egg from my house in Broward) to pay my medical expenses because of the horrible insurance we have here. I have spent more than half the money I saved to buy a house, now I doubt we can ever get one. It is very discouraging, to say the least.

The housing survey did not address the problem that I (and many other teachers) currently have. I own my own home. I was fortunate enough to purchase it before the housing market went insane. However, the insurance rates are going insane now. I received notification that my mortgage is DOUBLING next month. This is a result of the insurance and tax changes in the last two years. I have a \$10,000+ shortfall in my escrow and (obviously) increased payments from now until forever.

My insurance and taxes are *more than* my principal and interest. My parents paid to put me through college so that I could get a job and support myself. I have never asked them for a dime since. I had to call my father and borrow money to pay the back escrow. The other options were to forfeit my house or sell it and leave the Keys.

I realize that we have gotten significant increases in salary in the past few years. I appreciate it! I really do. But even those increases are not keeping up with the cost of living increases. This is my ninth year teaching at Coral Shores High School. I love my job. I love teaching in this school. I love the Keys. I would like to raise my son here. I would like to retire from this position. But I will not be able to if my mortgage keeps going up faster than my salary.

I live on a boat. I own my boat but pay slip rental. Where does that put me as far as the survey questions go? If affordable housing was available I would be interested. What about affordable slip rentals!!
